#### Suggested actions and movement



Make leaves with your hands bringing them down in front of the body to show falling down.



Twist wrists around to show swirling action of the leaves moving to the ground.



Lie down on the ground quietly just like a leaf!



Jump up and twirl arms and body around like a leaf blowing up to the sky.



Repeat VI actions to finish.




If you're using a parachute this is perfect for showing self control and listening skills making the leaves go up and down and laying them quietly on the ground for V3 then whizzing up in V4. NB - The leaves will go everywhere but fun is 100% guaranteed!

#### Suggested adaptations



VI - Gently move your fingers down over baby's tummy. V2 - Use the tips of your fingers to make a swirling action around baby's tummy. V3 - Make sssh noise and put finger on lips. V4 - Gently blow to make the sensation of the wind and move fingers up baby's tummy and arms. Repeat VI action to finish.



Enjoy performing the actions for sitting babies or gently moving their arms along to the actions. You could pick them up and have a dance around like leaves to the song too, lifting them up and down like a leaf, twirling around, laying on the ground and whizzing up into the sky!

Why not try...

Leaf Puzzle

Rompecabezas

de las hojas

Using leaves that have been found outdoors, cut them in half and jumble up on a large surface.

Ask children to put them together like a jigsaw puzzle and stick down - this is great for observation and can be adapted to suit all age groups by cutting the leaves in half, quarters, or beyond.
