Fecus word: a tree - un árbel (een ahr-behl)



## I'm a tree ~ Sey un arbel

Soy un árbol I'm a tree Mira, mira Look at me

> Soy un árbol I'm a tree Alto, tall Look at me

Tengo ramas
I have branches

#### Suggested actions and movement

Start standing up with arms by sides point to yourself on the words 'Mira ~ Look'. Reach hands and fingers up high to make a tall tree.
Repeat 'Look' action.

Point to trunk of body then make strong action with arms.

Slowly reach arms out to the sides to make ramas ~ branches and lean to each side to demonstrate length.

Keep arms
outstretched and
open hands wide to
show leaves.

Open and close hands to show muchas ~ so many.



Repeat start of VI to finish making yourself into a tall tree ~ un árbol muy alto.



#### Suggested adaptations

**0-6** mths

With baby sat in a bouncer, or laid down, enjoy performing actions to them making lots of emphasised movements.

6 mths - 1 yr

· Perform the actions for baby and encourage them to make the movements themselves, lifting their arms up to be a tree!







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Why not try...

Nature Rubbings

Calcos de la Naturaleza

Equipment: Paper & Wax crayons

Take the children outside and model how to take a tree rubbing using paper and a wax crayon against the trunk  $\sim$  el tronco of a tree.

- Take rubbings of sticks and leaves too on separate pieces of paper.
- When back in the setting or at home, look together at the rubbings, which one is 'el tronco'? What about 'las ramas' and 'las hojas'?

This is a perfect opportunity to reinforce the árbol vocabulary for this week.
