Actions



Start by making a wooly sheep action with little fingers curling away from the face.



Put both hands out the side making a question action



Nod head to make Yes/Sí action



Put 3 fingers up on one hand



Put fingers up one by one on other hand



1 Run index and middle finger down one arm



3 Point to side with one thumb to gesture round the corner



5 Make your cheekiest face!

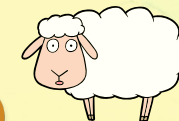

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Why not try...

Sheep Shearing

Esquila las ovejas

Equipment: Card, white paper, Gluestick or sellotape, Safety Scissors

1. Create the basic outline of a sheep with a large fluffy fleece cloud shape, head and legs.
2. Cut strips of white paper and make them into rolls around an inch wide. Stick the rolls to the fleece shape on the sheep - as many as you like.
3. Give children the safety scissors and let them practice their scissor skills shearing the sheep and giving it a nice new fleece ~ un nuevo vallón!
